Dance & Kinesiology Dual Degrees Intercollegiate Transfer Process

This joint dual degrees program operates unlike any other dual degrees at Illinois. Students will earn a Bachelor of Arts in Dance and a Bachelor of Science in Kinesiology. The primary college of residence for all years is FAA (College of Fine and Applied Arts). ICT from Kinesiology to Dance/Kinesiology Dual Degrees

- Students should audition as soon as possible, during the first-year. Auditions are available two to three times a year, typically in November and in winter/spring. See upcoming audition information at <https://dance.illinois.edu/programs-applying/undergraduate-programs/application-audition/>.
- Dance will review your academic record and audition and inform you of the admissions decision.
- The earliest students can change from Kinesiology to Dance/Kinesiology Dual Degrees is the term immediately following a successful audition (ideally spring of your first year). For questions on access to Dance courses while you await your decision, please reach out to your Kinesiology advisor.

ICT from Dance to Dance/Kinesiology Dual Degrees

- Students should complete the AHS inter-college transfer application after the completion of their first-year at <http://bit.ly/kinict>.
- Requirements and directions are at: <https://ahs.illinois.edu/undergrad-ahs-ict>.
- You should include your intention to complete the Dual Degrees in your personal statement. Students can expect to receive an admission decision about a month after the deadline.
- The earliest students can change from Dance to Dance/Kinesiology Dual Degrees is after the completion of your first year. For questions on access to Kinesiology courses while you await your decision, please reach out to your dance advisor.

ICT from other UIUC majors to Dance/Kinesiology Dual Degrees

- Students should inform their advisor of their intent to pursue this pathway at New Student Registration. Generally, the earliest students can change from another UIUC major to Dance/Kinesiology Dual Degrees is after the completion of your first year. It may be possible for the Dance major to be added for spring of your first year if you audition in the fall, with your dual degrees declared for the start of sophomore year.
- Students should audition as soon as possible. Auditions are available two to three times a year, typically in November and in winter/spring. See upcoming audition information at <https://dance.illinois.edu/programs-applying/undergraduate-programs/application-audition/>.

- Dance and Kinesiology will review your academic record, Kinesiology application, and Dance audition and inform you of the admissions decisions separately. Once you have received both acceptances, follow directions below.

Once Accepted into Dance and Kinesiology

1. Complete the [FAA Dual Degrees form](#) with your academic advisors and obtain signatures
 - a. You do not need to wait until you have earned 30 hours
 - b. You will not need to complete the residency requirement
2. Accept your offer to the Dual Degrees using the [FAA Curriculum Acceptance form](#)

3. These two forms will be processed simultaneously and the following will be updated for you by college admissions and records officers:
 - Both degrees will be added to your academic record (1DKR0261BA; 1DKY0351BS)
 - FAA/Dance major for primary residency (1DKR0261BA)
 - Students will have course access for courses in both majors
 - Degree audits (separate for each degree) will be updated to include the 30 additional hours campus requires for dual degree seekers. Students will always need to run their Kinesiology degree audit as a “what-if.”
 - FAA 101 will be waived for students who did not start in FAA
 - DANC will be added to your Correlate Area Studies requirement for Kinesiology
 - KIN will be added to your Hours in non-Dance classes requirement for Dance
 - Added to email list-serves for both degree programs
