





4-H alumni turns project/hobby into a career

When asked what part of 4-H made the biggest impact on him, Stetson Bierman said "My 4-H projects". An obvious answer since he took his horse project to the next level, all the way to the rodeo. Stetson, 19 year old son of Bret and Jody Bierman of Hidalgo, is currently attending the University of Tennessee, Martin where he is a member of the collegiate rodeo team. The team finished fourth in the Ozark Region, just missing the College National Finals. In addition his college studies and competing on the rodeo team, Stetson competes in the rodeo circuit.

A step ahead in agriculture, leadership and communication skills are opportunities Stetson says 4-H gave him that he wouldn't have gotten from other groups/programs. During his tenure in 4-H, Stetson held all office positions in the Grandville Gang 4-H Club. He was also a member of the Jasper County 4-H Federation, serving as president for one year. His fondest memories of federation are going to Holiday World and playing Laser Tag. His 4-H projects consisted of cattle, swine, and horses. All these experiences taught him time management, communication skills, responsibility, and to take pride in his work; all skills he is using to help him succeed in school and the rodeo circuit. He forgot to mention generosity. The interview with Stetson for this article took place between events during the Professional Rodeo Cowboys Association's rodeo recently held in Palestine, IL. During the interview Stetson was picking up trash and throwing it in trash cans.

His happiest 4-H memories were showing livestock with his friends and against them in a competitive, but fun way. When his buddies won and he didn't, Stetson was happy for them. 4-H is where he got to meet and hang out with this closest friends.

Stetson's rodeo experiences include:

Illinois High School Rodeo Association where he was a two time State Bareback Riding Champion and the All Around Rookie Cowboy his junior year.

Finishing in the top 15 bareback riders in the world at the National High School Rodeo Finals during his senior year in high school.

Currently leading in the Whippoorwill Rodeo Series and the Lone Star Rodeo Series.

Standing 11th in the world in the International Professional Rodeo Association.

Standing 9th in the Great Lakes Circuit in the Professional Rodeo Cowboys Association.

Bareback Bronc riding is Stetson's favorite rodeo event with saddle bronc riding coming in second. In September, Stetson competed close to home (Palestine, IL) in the hardest rodeo circuit, the Professional Rodeo Cowboys Association. Stetson's goal is to compete in this circuit's culminating event held in Las Vegas, NV.

Stetson would tell today's parents that "4-H gives youth more opportunities and chances to get involved in something worthwhile. It truly shows when youth are involved in 4-H. They enjoy what 4-H has to offer and it keeps them out of trouble." To the youth he would say, "4-H is a great program. It's a lot of fun! I'm truly glad that I had the opportunity to get involved. It's not just your typical youth program. And, you get to meet lots of new people."



Become a certified 4-H shooting sports instructor

Help ensure young people are exposed to everything the outdoors and shooting sports has to offer by becoming a certified 4-H shooting sports volunteer. The first ever one day "hands on" field day training will be held Saturday, Oct. 19, 2019 at



4-H Memorial Camp in Monticello. Volunteers may now become certified shooting sports leaders by attending the field day and completing an on-line youth development training module at home. Once both are complete, you are certified!

Your first stop is the local Extension office where staff will discuss the current program in our county.

Complete the required application and background checks. Volunteers must be at least 21 years of age.

Pay the \$60 registration cost that covers three meals, snacks, instructor curriculum, hat, and all necessary equipment and materials for the training.

Staff will complete your registration. Registration is due October 9.

Attend certification training from 9 a.m. to 7 p.m. Saturday, October 19 at 4-H Memorial Camp near Monticello. Complete additional online training.

Check back in with the county Extension staff to begin volunteering.

There are six concentrations of study, and volunteers must choose only one discipline: archery, rifle, shotgun, pistol, and hunting and outdoor skills, as well as the overall county coordinator training. Remember, volunteers will work with their local Extension 4-H staff to establish or add to an existing shooting sports program in the county. The Youth in Action Award honors four 42H members who have gained critical life skills through their 42H experience and have used those skills to overcome a challenge or challenges they have faced. Each of the honorees epitomize 42H youth empowerment and leadership. In addition, the winners have demonstrated the positive impact they've made with their family, peers, and community through their 42H experiences.

Nominate outstanding 4-H members in four different categories: Agriculture, Civic Engagement, Healthy Living, and STEM. Each winner will receive a \$5,000 scholarship for higher education, be featured as the 42H youth spokesperson for their pillar area, receive an allexpenses paid trip to Washington, D.C. to be recognized at National 42H Council's Legacy Awards, and network with celebrities and prominent 4-H alumni. IMPORTANT: The state deadline for awards has been changed to November 1. Don't miss your chance to apply. Award applications are available online at **go.illinois.edu/4Happly**:

- **Key Award**: This award focuses on Leadership, Community Service and Mentoring. Members 16-19 are eligible for this award.
- **State 4-H Award**: Members may apply in any or all of the five award categories: *Communications, Community Service, Leadership, Personal Growth*, and/or *Project Mastery*. State winners in these categories can receive educational scholarships or trips to national events. This award is open to members 15-18.
- **Vet Science Award**: Outstanding members enrolled in the 4-H Veterinary Science Project are eligible to apply for a \$200 cash award. Check with your county for their deadline for this award.
- **4-H Leadership, Citizenship, and Professionalism Award**: Applicants must be 17-19 and exemplify leadership, citizenship and professionalism skills. This award is sponsored by the Illinois Farm Bureau and Affiliate Companies. Winners will be invited to a 3-day Premier 20 Youth Leadership Conference in April.
- **Experience Award**: focuses on all of those events and activities that you have experienced during the 4-H year in four areas: *Participation, Community Service, Leadership,* and *Project Learning*. Depending upon the type and number of experiences you report on, members can receive recognition on the Bronze, Silver, Gold, Diamond or Emerald Clover Award level. Your family calendar, 4-H notes or county summary, checkmarks, and a few written details are all that's needed to submit this application. This award is open to 4-H members of all ages!

New certification required for youth exhibiting livestock

4-H members exhibiting animals entering the food production system will be required to complete the **Youth for the Quality Care of Animal** certification (YQCA). It will replace former trainings: PQA and QAEC. This program is the industry-standard certification. Check with local offices about completing the training. The training must be completed each year.

Horses, dogs, and cats will still be required to take the **Quality Assurance and Ethics** (QAEC) training. This training is only required once in the member's career.

Paper Clover Campaign returns in October

Dates for the Fall Paper Clover Campaign, held in conjunction with Tractor Supply Stores and National 4-H Council, are October 9 - 20. Money donated during the campaign STAYS in that local county. The campaign runs twice a year.
